Trent Savill is a consultant therapist and the Director of Complex Care. Trent has been working with complex and high-risk young people in the child-protection system for the last 15 years, providing consultancy to the Department of Communities (Child Safety) and Non-government sector, intensive in-home therapy to children and families, training to carers and professionals, and has previously coordinated residential care programs. Trent's primary role now involves consulting with the Department and other agencies around their most complex cases and delivering training around the provision of therapeutic care for our most at-risk and vulnerable children.
